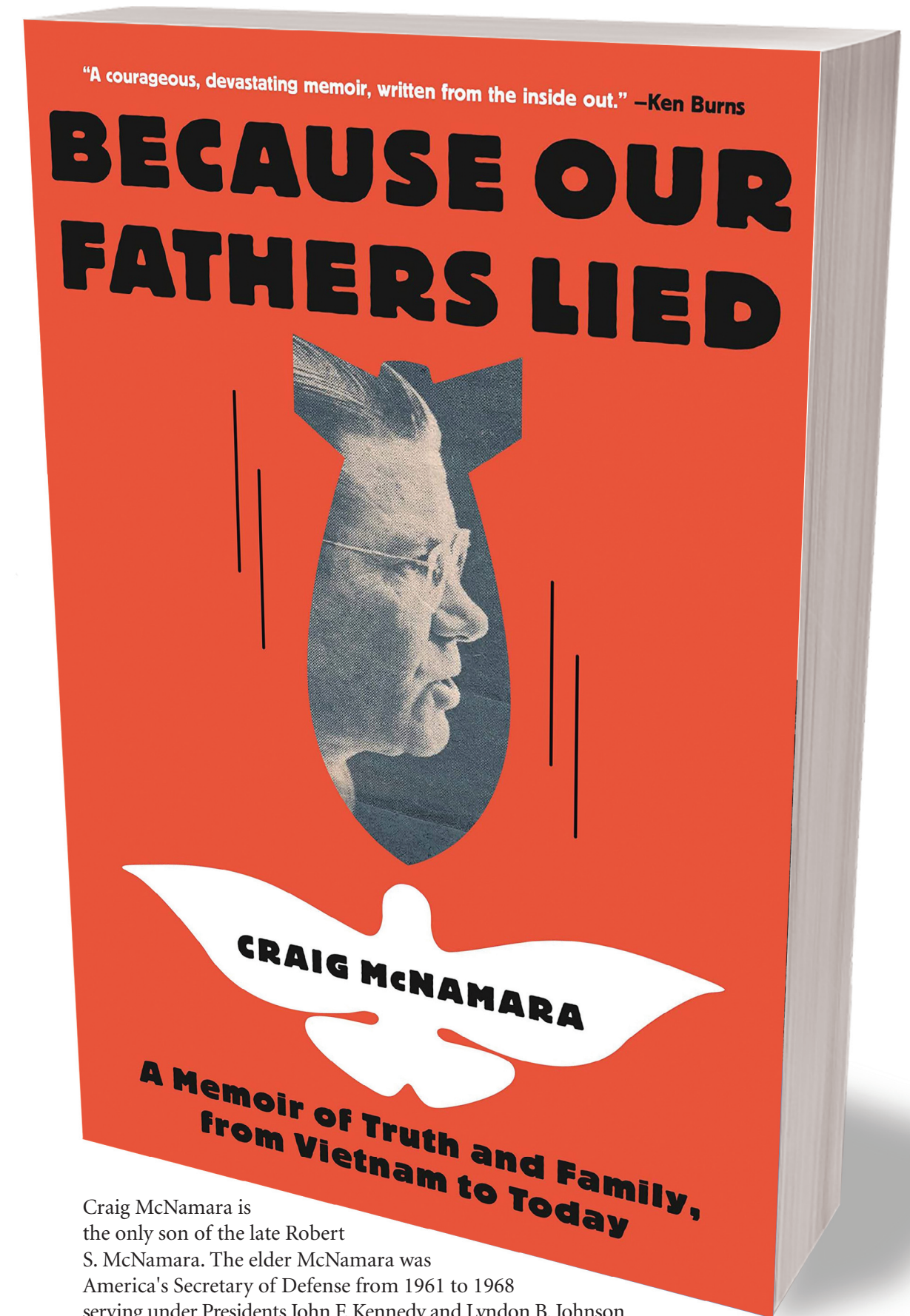
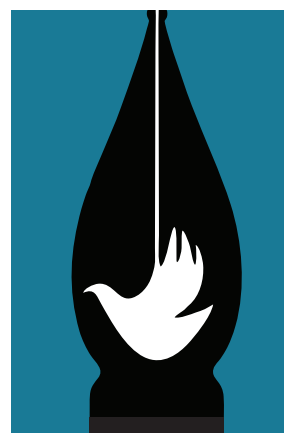

Craig McNamara is the only son of the late Robert S. McNamara. The elder McNamara was America's Secretary of Defense from 1961 to 1968 serving under Presidents John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson and is widely considered to have been the architect of America's war in Vietnam. As a college student during the war years, Craig McNamara became an antiwar activist.
